Our organisation is concerned about the re-development of the local area. We welcome re-development and we are happy for the investment to help assist and re-invigorate the local community. However we are concerned that the local community have been isolated from the process and that many of the changes will not benefit them. We are particularly concerned about the plans to build houses on the Green Space in the Lordship Recreational Ground. this would affect Our bicycle workshop and community hub - it should be noted that the council have just agreed a 5 year lease with our organisation to run youth engagement, cycling and educational programmes from this facility. Also the football pitches used by the Broadwater Farm community football teams will have nowhere to play football is these plans go ahead.

Also the space where the present car park in Tottenham Green Leisure Centre - which has also been earmarked for housing development, is of interest to us. We fee it should compliment the Leisure centre with some outdoor recreational space - i.e, outdoor basketball/5-a-side football/tennis court space - or MUGA (Multi games usage)area to engage local people - with floodlights. this could complement the Leisure Centre greatly as well as engage the local young people.
